UINR is a non-profit natural resource management organization that works on behalf of Cape Breton's five Mi'kmaw communities toward a sustainable Unama'ki.

The Wildlife Biologist is responsible for assisting with the Maliamu'kik Msit Ko'kqmanaq Species at Risk program and other duties that emerge as required by UINR management.

Key Responsibilities

Design and conduct wildlife population surveys; Compile, prepare, analyze, and manage survey data;
Use maps, aerial photographs and other tools to design field data collection programs
Conduct, supervise, and organize logistics for various field operations
Communicate effectively both internally within the workplace and to stakeholders, and externally to the broader public; Research, make recommendations for, and assist in, habitat restoration;
Study wildlife populations, location data, behaviour, and habitat inventories, often under harsh conditions and difficult schedules; Prepare technical reports and scientific papers
Maintain and prepare equipment for fieldwork; Monitor the status and trends of wildlife populations

Personal Requirements

Must be highly motivated; Must have professionalism and integrity; Be a self-starter
Experience in technical research, monitoring, writing, and communications
Experience working with Unama'ki Mi'kmaq communities an asset.
Must be willing and able to work flexible hours, including evenings and weekends, and at times in inclement weather, as field research requires
Must have a valid NS Drivers License, with access to reliable transportation to travel to field locations.
